Independent Auditor's Review Report on the Financial Results of the Company Pursuant to the Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended

Review Report to,
The Board of Directors of
M/s Tosha International Limited

We have audited the Financial Results ("the Statement") for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025 (Financial Results) included in the accompanying "Statement of Audited Results for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025 ('the statement') of Tosha International Ltd ("the Company") being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended, including relevant circulars issued by the SEBI from time to time.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Financial Results for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025:

- (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Regulations; and
- (ii) give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net profit and total comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter and year then ended.

Material uncertainty related to going concern

We draw attention to Note 7 in the financial statements, which indicates that the company has incurred a net loss of Rs 288.09 Lakhs during the year ended 31 March 2025 and accumulated Losses are Rs 4009.84 as of that date. The equity of the company is fully eroded. The operations of the company are suspended since 2003. These indicate that a material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt on the company's ability to continue business operations as a going concern, but the management is hopeful to start the operations in the coming period and financial statements are being prepared on a Going concern basis. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under Section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (lithe Act"). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the 'Auditors' Responsibilities for the audit of the Financial Results for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025' section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (lithe ICAI") together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the Financial Results for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025, under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Financial Results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under Section I 43(3)(i) of the Act, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion on whether the Company has adequate internal financial controls with reference to standalone Ind AS financial statements in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Board of Directors.
- Evaluate the appropriateness and reasonableness of disclosures made by the Board of Directors in terms of the requirements specified under regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Board of Directors' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the Statement of standalone Ind AS financial results or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion, our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure, and content of the Statement, including the disclosures, and whether the Statement represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.
- Obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the Financial Results of the Company to express an opinion on the Financial Results.
